
### Highlights of the year

In June we held our annual Sports Day but this year we took the whole school to Tipton Sports Academy. It was a fantastic day that the children thoroughly enjoyed and was really well attended by parents and families.





Each year we take some classes on residential visits which we believe are an integral part of the curriculum that we offer. This Year Y6 attended Pioneer and both Year 5 and Year 6 went to Upton Warren.











We celebrate mass in school on a weekly basis and really appreciate the dedication of Fr Stan who was the Parish Priest at St Michael's but will be moving to Holy Cross in September.

Younger children are kindly supported by older pupils in order that all classes are able to lead made during the course of the year.

We have organised numerous trips to big sporting events in order to inspire our pupils. These include Wasps rugby, Worcester Warriors, West Bromwich Albion, Twickenham and Worcester Wolves basketball.

In the Autumn term our dance club performed on court at half-time in a Worcester Wolves fixture. We took a coach full of 70 people to the event.





We have been working hard to encourage pupils to learn their times tables. We held a maths super hero day where we practiced mental maths skills in various fun ways.

During Lent, in the build up to Easter, we hold assemblies in school to commemorate the events of Holy Week and we also take classes to St Michael's to join in with Stations of the Cross services.





We have competed in numerous sports fixtures, events and competitions over the course of the academic year and had lots of success. Main highlights include reaching the Birmingham County Football Final at the AVFC training ground, Sandwell champions in tag rugby, girls' cricket, girls' football and indoor athletics, and winning the Birmingham schools Tag Rugby competition for both boys and girls.

Due to having a few diabetic pupils in school, we wanted to make all children and adults more aware of diabetes in terms of the effect it has on people, signs to look out for and what to do if a diabetic pupil appears high or low.

Chris Pennell of Worcester Warriors and England who has diabetes himself, came to school to work with the children and help to further educate us.





### **Key moments**



#### **Key moment 1**

We have introduced a book literacy scheme which will continue into the 2018/19 academic year. Each class studies two books in detail and do lots of activities related to these texts. Although only in its first year, we have seen the impact already in terms of increasing pupil enjoyment of reading (particularly for boys).



#### **Key moment 2**

In order to inspire writing, we have had three big events this year: the visit of the animal man, Kristian Thomas (Olympic gymnast) visit and a lego day. Having enjoyed the days, all pupils then completed a series of writing activities and results showed an improvement in work in terms of language used and levels of effort due to being highly motivated.

### **Key moment 3**

During the 2017/18 academic year, we have raised over £2500 for charity with events such as non-uniform days, toy donations, penny race, sponsored events, breakfast mornings. We have supported charities including Alzheimer's, Bloodwise, Barnardos, Brushstrokes and Macmillan.


### Looking forward to next year

### What are we aiming to achieve academically next year?

We have two key foci for the 2018/19 year in order to further improve upon what we already do. Through embedding reciprocal reading, introducing outdoor libraries to further promote a love of reading and teaching reading comprehension more frequently in all classes, we hope to increase the number of pupils achieving greater depth and ensure that all pupils can read aloud more confidently and have a deeper understanding of what they have read.

Secondly, by introducing daily times table practice in all classes and improving our super hero testing system, we aim for all pupils to become more confident in recalling their times tables. We will be inviting parents into school to see how well we are doing with this towards the end of the Autumn term.

#### What can we expect from next year?



This year also sees our biennial multi-cultural celebration where all classes will be studying a religion and visiting a place of worship before teaching the rest of the school what they have learnt in a special assembly.

We will continue to offer the children a range of exciting sporting experiences with a number of trips to major events already planned. Our huge number of sports fixtures and competitions will also continue for all age ranges and we hope to beat our outstanding figure of 158 children representing the school last year.

Pupils tell us that KS2 rotation is a highlight of the week for them so this will continue as well as introducing a similar system in KS1 later in the year.
